Project overview:

With help from the Norfolk Museums Conservation and Design Services team, the museum completed a project of de-framing and storage rationalisation. Unframed works were re-housed in conservation grade boxes, and works were digitised in the process. As a result over 200 previously inaccessible artworks, are now available to view by appointment by the public.

- Improved access to artworks in store
- Increased number of works included in digitisation project
- Improved storage
- New skills and knowledge developed in curatorial team
- New local conservation contacts made

Assessing the Significance of Bronze Age Collections

Project overview:

Experts were brought in to carry out the reviews, which led to a greater understanding of the significance, condition and research potential of the metal and wood objects within the Flag Fen collections. This information informed a revised conservation plan and programme of treatment for the collections.

- Several items were identified as being rare and of local and national/international significance
- Improved written interpretation of the objects on display
- Have identified a potential postgraduate researcher to work on the wooden items
- Improved public access to the collections





Photographic Collection Review and Rationalisation

With advice from Norfolk Heritage Centre staff, the museum identified the keys issues involved with working with a photographic collection. An ongoing aim of the project is to speed up retrieval of images, to improve storage, and to digitise the collection.

Collections Review and Action Planning

Project overview:

The consultant reviewed, photographed, and catalogued 220 objects, entering the data onto a spreadsheet to be imported into the Modes database. The consultant trained volunteers in this methodology, which led to further digital photography training and a rationalisation project. As a result of the work, stores were improved, and a report and action plan were produced.

What's in Store? Reviewing social history and art collections

Project overview:

20,000 objects were assessed and reviewed through an extensive audit. As a result, the content of records was improved, conservation and storage needs addressed, digital images taken, and items were identified for disposal or transfer. External expert advice was taken in person, by phone and email. Funds were also used for physically moving collections as well as new boxes.

Early Film Collection Review

Project overview:

An external expert assessed the early film collection to identify any issues with the condition and storage of the films. The project also aimed to improve documentation of all AV collections, and to work towards their digitisation. 900 CDs/DVDs were added to the catalogue, as well as 478 items from the early film collections. A detailed report was produced by the consultant.

Review and Audit of Small Finds Archaeology Collection
